

Smell? What To Do


Dirty Socks

It's not uncommon to smell a scent similar to dirty socks when you first start up your air conditioning system for the summer season. This smell is an accumulation of stagnant water and dirty evaporator coils. It should go away after running your system for a few hours.



Mold and Mildew

Mold and mildew are prone to growing in damp and dark environments, similar to that of your HVAC venting. If you smell these distinctive odors, it can be a sign that you have a water leak that can be feeding fungi growth in your ductwork. It's best to get AC services before the mold spreads and creates health hazards for your family and home.



Burning Smell

When your air conditioning system produces a burning smell, it should be a large cause for concern. There are many components in your system that can burn up, including motors and electrical wiring.
